Calgary needs an Indigenous Gathering Place to showcase and affirm the continued presence and value of indigenous peoples and cultures in our treaty area.

Healthy sharing occurs when like-minded organizations are in physical proximity. Staff, volunteers, and patrons all benefit from a friendly, equitable approach to sharing resources and the quality of each endeavour is enhanced. Currently elders and knowledge keepers have no welcoming environment to connect people with indigenous heritage. In addition, non-indigenous organizations like ours seek opportunities to be educated in indigenous culture and issues. While institutions like the Public Library have made strides in facilitating exchanges, a dedicated gathering place will encourage and reflect respect for indigenous cultures in our city's history and contemporary life. The building -- its historically significant location, its stature, and the activities it holds – will be a physical expression of reconciliation, healing, and celebration. Our youth will grow in its presence with the knowledge that indigenous culture and traditions are important to us as a society.

We ask you to vote to transfer land near the confluence of the Bow and Elbow Rivers to the Indigenous Gathering Place Society of Calgary and to continue to prioritize this important project.
